Director's Report, Fall 2018

Fall has finally arrived after a hot and rainy summer and the temperatures have started to cool. I just returned from Savannah, Georgia, where the 2020 American Daylily Society (ADS) National will be held.

A few highlights from the Fall Board meeting are as follows:

Membership: Region 6 has 446 members, down 25 from 2017. Total ADS membership as of September 22 is 5736, down 45 from 2017. The participation in the Chaperone listing with the American Horticulture Society has helped in lessening the loss of members. The Puget Sound Daylily Club won the \$500 Daylily Voucher drawing for clubs who have Gold or Platinum status. Region 6 was represented by 4 clubs that have Gold or Platinum status. I would like to congratulate the following clubs for reaching the following status in 2018: Austin Daylily Society - Platinum, Brazosport Daylily Society - Gold, Cypress Creek Daylily Club - Platinum, Lufkin Hemerocallis Society - Platinum, and Johnson County Iris and Daylily Society - Silver.

Email Robin: The Email Robin will be for ADS members, only. Non-members will be deleted at the first of the year.

Exhibition Judges: Region 6 has 3 Junior, 28 Senior, 5 Honorary, 9 Instructors, and 10 Instructors in Training Judges.

The 2018 Lenington All American Award winner is Hemerocallis 'White Eyes Pink Dragon' (Gossard, 2006). The 2018 Stout Silver Medal winner is H. 'Entwined in the Vine' (Emmerich, 2007).

For the Facebook Auction each Region should donate two items to the auction. The items can be of any value and any type. If you would like to donate an item, fill out the auction donation form online at <https://daylilies.org/auctiondonations/> by December 1, 2018.

Meg Ryan, Executive Editor of The Daylily Journal, is retiring at the end of the year. The Board approved Adele Keohan as the new Editor and Advertising Manager for The Daylily Journal.

Approved the following Technology projects for updating the ADS website:

- Current Website Change Requests
- Database Redesign/Integration

- E-Commerce Solution - Create an e-commerce module to move from selling books on the Portal and move to one resource, our website
- Photo Repository Solution - ADS currently stores images in multiple locations and there is no central repository for the photos to be cataloged, stored, accessed, or managed. This project will come up with a method that will enable ADS to manage all the photos and access them accordingly.
- Popularity Poll Voting System Redesign - New additions to allow the Popularity Poll Chair to provide custom configuration options to Regions, to export online votes, and to input tabulator results without assistance. This will give the Chair access to the existing validation tools. In addition, code will be provided which will interface with the new DaylilyAPI to display the ballots and the results directly within the new website.

Finally, do not forget to register for the 2019 Region 6 Meeting in Albuquerque, New Mexico, and the 2019 ADS National Convention in Madison, Wisconsin.
